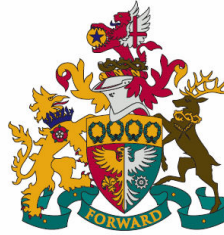

Sub-Committee Hearings Protocol for determining applications under the Gambling Act 2005

This protocol outlines the procedures that will apply:

It is important that you carefully read these procedures if you wish to attend and be heard at a Licensing sub-committee hearing

1. On receiving the Notice of Hearing

What is the Notice of Hearing?

Hillingdon Democratic Services will give appropriate notice of the hearing, which depends upon the type of application to be considered. Exact timings are shown on the front page of the Agenda (attached to the front of the Notice of Hearing).

A Notice of the Hearing will be sent to all parties accompanied by:

- Date, time and location of the actual hearing and a procedural briefing to be held beforehand;
- This procedure note, the report from the Council's Licensing Officer with relevant requests attached;
- Confirmation that a party may be assisted / represented by a person who does not have to be legally qualified;
- Confirmation that a party to the hearing may address the authority, give further information on a point on which the authority requires clarification and, if considered by the authority to be required, question another party to the hearing;
- The consequences of not attending or being represented at a hearing (which normally will be that the hearing will proceed in the party's absence); and
- A note of any particular points on which the Hillingdon Licensing Service wants clarification.

What do I do when I receive the Notice of Hearing?

On receipt of the Notice of Hearing, all parties must inform the Clerk to the Committee – **normally no later than 2 working days before the hearing*** – whether they:

- Intend to attend or to be represented at the hearing;
- Consider a hearing to be unnecessary; and
- Wish to request that another person appear at the hearing (other than their representative) as a witness. If such a request is made, it should be accompanied by details of the name of that person and a full description of the points about which that person may be able to assist the hearing.

*Full details are given in the front of the Notice of Hearing of the deadline by which you should give your notice. All those who have made a request and the premises licence holder are also reminded of their right to have a legal representative at the hearing.

If a party does not notify the above to the Clerk to the Committee before the relevant deadline they will not be entitled to speaking rights at the hearing.

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU REPLY TO THE NOTICE

If I want to withdraw my request - how do I do this?

Any party may withdraw their request by contacting the Clerk to the Committee by telephone, letter or email, providing they give notice no later than 24 hours before the hearing. If, during the hearing, any party wishes to withdraw their request they may do so orally by informing the Chairman.

What happens if I cannot attend the sub-committee hearing?

When a party informs the authority that he/she cannot attend the hearing or, without prior notice, fails to attend or be represented at the hearing, the sub-committee may either adjourn the hearing to a specified date, but **only** where it considers this to be necessary in the public interest or necessary for its consideration of any representations. Alternatively, the sub-committee may hold the hearing in the party's absence.

Where the sub-committee adjourns the hearing it shall notify the parties of the new date, time and place to which the hearing has been adjourned. Where the hearing is held in the absence of a party the sub-committee will still consider the application or any representations submitted by that party.

Can the date of the hearing be changed?

Only if the Licensing sub-committee scheduled for that hearing, considers it to be necessary in the public interest or necessary for its consideration of any representations made by a party. In all other circumstances, the licensing authority cannot be flexible in the dates for hearings as the Gambling Act 2003 sets a strict legal deadline by which hearings must be heard.

Can you accommodate any special needs I may have?

Yes, if any person, who intends to be present at the hearing, has any special needs, (for example in connection with access, hearing, language or vision) this should be brought to the attention of the Clerk to the Committee prior to the hearing in order that appropriate provision may be made.

2. Before the Hearing

You will have been notified of the date and time of the Licensing Sub-committee hearing. The hearings will normally take place at the Civic Centre, High Street, Uxbridge in one of the Committee Rooms.

How do I get to the Civic Centre?

Parking may be available via the entrance to the Civic Centre in the High Street by contacting the Clerk to the Committee in advance. Parking is also available in the nearby Chimes Shopping Centre Car Park. Bus routes 607, 427, U1, U3, U4 and U7 all stop at the Civic Centre. Uxbridge underground station, with the Piccadilly and Metropolitan lines, is a short walk away.

Please enter from the main reception where you will be directed to the relevant Committee Room. Please switch off your mobile phone when entering the room and note that Hillingdon Council operates a no-smoking policy in its offices.

Will the hearing be in public?

There may be other members of the public and press that attend the hearing to observe the proceedings, but they will not be allowed to speak. At any hearing, the person who has made the application may attend in person or, if the application is made by an organisation or corporate body, a duly authorised representative may be present, who is able to speak on their behalf can do so.

The hearing will take place in public. However, in exceptional circumstances, when the sub-committee considers that it is in the public interest, it may exclude the public from all or any part of a hearing. Hearings will normally take place during the day.

I have some new evidence - may I present it?

The sub-committee **will not** normally allow the production of new written evidence not previously submitted by any party. In the case where the sub-committee does allow new evidence, all other parties must give their consent before it is heard.

If new material is permitted, the hearing may need to be adjourned to allow time to consider it and for other parties to respond to it. Accordingly, any application to have new material considered should demonstrate exceptional reasons for its admission. It is, therefore important for parties to ensure that all evidence is submitted in writing as soon as possible and in accordance with the relevant timescales.

Will I be briefed on procedure before the hearing?

Yes, in the notice of hearing, you will have been asked to attend a procedural briefing before the hearing starts. All parties will be asked to attend this briefing so that the Council's Legal Advisor can outline the procedures to be followed at the hearing.

What if there is more than one Applicant or a number of different Parties to the review attend the hearing?

At the briefing, the Legal Advisor may ask that a spokesman is agreed amongst those present who have similar requests for a review or representations in support.

Who are the people on the Licensing sub-committee?

Three elected councillors of the London Borough of Hillingdon sit on a Licensing sub-committee and it is only they who can determine the application. Its minimum membership is two. Councillors who sit on the sub-committees have been trained in the new Licensing regulations and have experience of determining applications of various kinds.

One of the Councillors will be the Chairman of the hearing and it will be he/she who will call interested parties and responsible authorities to speak and ensure time limits are adhered to as set out in the procedures.

Other people who will be present along with the Councillors include:

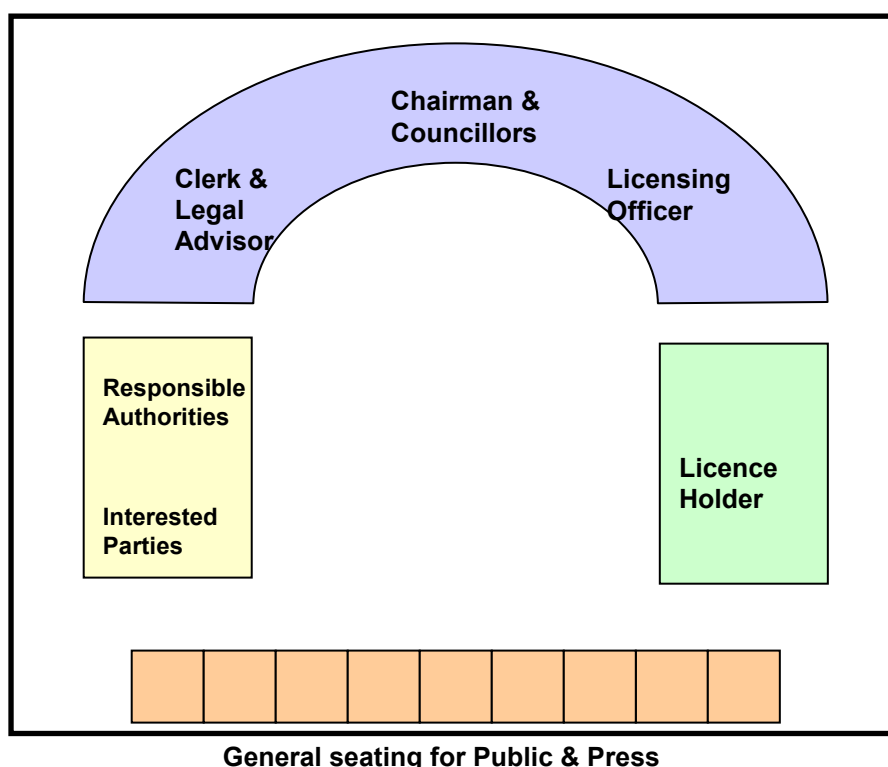
- The **Council's Licensing Officer** who will introduce the Officer report and outline his/her role.
- A **Legal Advisor** whose role is to assist the Committee with legal advice and to ensure that a fair and balanced hearing takes place.
- A **Clerk to the Committee** whose role is to summarise and record decisions on individual matters and to provide help and assistance to members of the public attending such meetings.

3. During the Hearing

The procedure at the sub-committee hearing will, in general, be based on those used in a court of law. Although the strict rules of evidence will not apply, they will be observed to a great extent, because this is the best way of hearing the evidence from all parties. The hearing will take the form of a discussion led by the sub-committee councillors. The sub-committee will seek clarification on the issues from the parties as it considers appropriate.

Where shall I sit at the hearing?

The hearing will begin immediately after the procedural briefing and the set up of the room for those involved will generally be as shown below:



In general, how will the hearing be conducted?

The procedure to be followed at the hearing will normally be as shown in the flow chart below, although all procedural matters will be subject to the discretion of the Chairman. All persons present will be requested to identify themselves and to give the reason for their presence. The sub-committee may consider any request from a party for another person to appear at the hearing as their representative.

It is important to note that cross-examination will not normally be permitted. Evidence, discussion and address must be relevant to the three licensing objectives under the 2005 Gambling Act. Repetition should also be avoided. The sub-committee will seek to prevent irrelevant and repetitive matters.

If, during its deliberations, the sub-committee considers that it is necessary for any person present at the hearing to provide further information or clarification on a particular point the

hearing may be reconvened to deal with that issue. The sub-committee can also ask for procedural, technical or legal matter from officers present at any time during the proceedings.

What is the order of proceedings?

The Chairman of the sub-committee will open the hearing by introducing the Councillors explaining the purpose of the proceedings and the general procedure. The Chairman will then check that there are no additions or alterations to the list of those appearing at the hearing, which will have been prepared in advance by the Clerk to the Committee and will then outline the procedure that will be followed for the remainder of the hearing. The procedure is as follows:

Introduction by the Council's Licensing Officer



The licensing officer will introduce the report and will outline impartially the matter before the sub-committee, giving any relevant background information.

The Applicant



The Chairman calls on the Applicant to present their case and brings forward any witnesses.

(Responsible Authorities/Interested Parties)



The Responsible Authorities and interested parties present their case, including calling any witnesses in support of their representations.

OPTIONAL - DISCUSSION LED BY THE SUB-COMMITTEE
A discussion will only occur if the sub-committee feels that there is a need for the parties involved to clarify each other's cases. The Chairman will lead the discussion.



Closing remarks from each Party

The Responsible Authorities, Interested Parties and the Applicant (s) make brief closing remarks on the application under question. The Applicant(s) makes the final closing remarks.



Sub-Committee Deliberates

The sub-committee will remain in the room to deliberate and make their decision, with only the Legal Advisor and Clerk to the Committee remaining. All other present will be asked to leave the room.



Chairman announces the Decision

Parties may return to the room when asked and the Chairman announces the decision. The Chairman reminds the applicant that the decision will be sent to them in writing. There can be no further questions or statements.

Can a councillor sit on a sub-committee if the application is in their ward?

Councillors who sit on a sub-committee are advised to take steps to minimise their involvement in any application prior to its consideration by the sub-committee so that decisions are seen to be reached at the hearing impartially and with an open mind. Councillors should not appear to be acting both as an advocate on behalf of their residents and as an adjudicator on an application.

If a Councillor on the sub-committee has already taken a view on an application in advance of the hearing, they should not be present for the hearing of the application and should leave the meeting room for that item. They should also not visit any premises under consideration prior to the hearing. In any cases of doubt, the Councillor should not sit on the sub-committee for a particular application. In this instance, a substitute Councillor may need to be found from the main Licensing committee of the Council or the hearing may continue as long as two of the three Councillors are still present.

The agenda papers will show which ward each Councillor sits for and the reports from the Council's Licensing Officer will detail which ward the application is in.

Can a ward Councillor make a representation and or speak at a hearing?

If a ward Councillor, who does not sit on the sub-committee, wishes to make a formal objection to an application they may only do so if they make a written relevant representation as would apply to an Interested Party and in the same way as any other member of the public using the procedures outlined in this protocol. If the ward Councillor believes they have a personal or prejudicial interest in the application, they may still submit a relevant representation.

Ward Councillors, who do not sit on the sub-committee, may also speak at a sub-committee hearing in support or against an application, for example on behalf of their constituents without notice. They may also speak as an advocate or witness on behalf of the applicant or an Interested Party, even if they believe they have a personal or prejudicial interest. However, for the purposes of transparency, at the hearing, the ward Councillor should disclose what their personal or prejudicial interest is and whether they have been in contact with the applicant, agent, Interested Party or responsible authority beforehand or have visited the premises concerned.

Ward Councillors making either a written relevant representation or wish to speak at a hearing should not communicate about the application before the hearing with any Councillors who sit on the sub-committee. This is so the sub-committee makes their decision with an open mind.

What power does the Chairman have to control the meeting?

Under the Gambling Act 2005, the Chairman may require any person attending the hearing who is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may refuse to permit that person to return or may permit the person to return only on such conditions as he or she may specify.

How will the sub-committee make its final decision?

Once the sub-committee has heard from officers and the parties to the hearing and has had answers to its questions, the sub-committee will remain in the room to deliberate and make their decision on the application with only the Legal Advisor and Clerk to the sub-committee remaining. The sub-committee must disregard any information given or evidence produced by

a party or witness, which is not relevant to the application, representations or notice or the promotion of the gambling objectives.

Members of the sub-committee have a duty to behave impartially, not to predetermine the issue and not to discuss matters with press or residents. In making its decision the sub-committee must state the reasons for that decision, taking into account the evidence presented by all parties during the hearing.

4. After the Hearing

When will we get formal notice of the decision?

The Chairman will normally announce the Sub-committee's decision in public at the end of the hearing and the reasons for the sub-committee's decision. This decision will then be communicated in writing to the parties as soon as possible after the hearing.

The Council's Legal Advisor will send the premises licence holder a decision letter shortly after the meeting outlining the decision and any conditions that are attached to the licence. In addition, a copy of the decision letter will be sent to all those who made an application for a review in connection with the premises. This will confirm the decision made; any conditions attached to a review application or the reasons for revocation. Details of the respective appeal rights will also be sent with this notice.

Can we appeal against the decision?

Following the decision, the premises licence holder or any person who has made an application for a review can appeal to the Magistrates Court.

All applications once they are lodged will be available for viewing on Hillingdon Council's website at www.hillingdon.gov.uk and in the Civic Centre Offices by appointment with the Licensing Service during working hours.

SUMMARY

To consider a representation and a petition from residents of Hayes Town Centre in respect of a new Premises Licence for a Betting premises at 35 Coldharbour Lane, Hayes.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Licensing Sub Committee determine the application.

INFORMATION

- 1.1 An application for a new gambling premises licence, to offer Betting facilities, was received by the Licensing Service on 7th March 2011.

The applicant is;
William Hill Organisation Ltd
Greenside House
50 Station Road
Wood Green
London N22 7TP

A copy of the application form is annexed to this report as **Appendix 1**.

- 1.2 The application was advertised in accordance with the standard procedures required by the Gambling Act 2005 by way of an advertisement in the local paper and the display of a notice in at the premises for the required 28 day consultation period. The application was also posted on the council's website.

Following the advertisement of the application a petition containing approx 460 signatures was received, organised by Mr Khalsa Singh.

A statement of representation was also received from Mr Khalsa Singh.

A copy of the petition and letter is annexed as **Appendix 2**.

1.3 In accordance with the legislation, the applicant is required to send copies of the application to the responsible authorities being:

- The Gambling Commission
- The Metropolitan Police Service
- H M Revenue & Customs
- London Fire & Emergency Planning Authority
- Child Protection Service, LBH
- Environmental Health Authority, LBH
- Trading Standards Service, LBH
- Planning Authority, LBH

No representations were received from Responsible Authorities.

1.4 The period for consultation and the making of representations in respect of this application expired on 5th April 2011

1.5 The applicant has made a standard premises licence application for betting facilities and has chosen not to exclude the default condition in respect of times of operation. The default times of operation for betting premises are between 07.00am and 22.00pm.

If a licence is granted for this premises, the Premises Licence Holder will have the mandatory and default conditions attached to the premises licence. Copy attached as **Appendix 3**

1.6 The applicant has an Operating Licence issued by the Gambling Commission to provide betting facilities.

1.7 **General Information about the premises**

- The premises is single shop unit in a busy town centre environment
- The immediate area of Station Road, Coldharbour Lane and Botwell Lane currently has a total of 6 licensed betting shops –
 - William Hill, 57 Station Road
 - Paddy Power, 39 Station Road
 - Jenningsbet, 19b Station Road
 - Ladbrokes, 9-13 Botwell Lane
 - Ladbrokes, 13 Coldharbour Lane
 - Ladbrokes, 74 Coldharbour Lane

1.8 The majority of the petitioners either reside or have business/religious interests in the local area.

1.9 **Statement of Gambling Policy**

Part 4 of the Council's Gambling policy refers to Premises Licences.

Part 4.22 of the Council's Gambling policy refers to conditions for premises licences.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 2.0 Members should be aware that the Planning, Environment, Education and Community Service does not have a budget provision for costs, should the applicant be successful in appealing to the Court(s) against a decision of the Council. In the event that a Court was to uphold an appeal, officers would need to identify how the costs would be funded before action could be taken in order to comply with Council financial policy.

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

The Gambling Act 2005 creates three licensing objectives-

1. Preventing gambling from being a source of crime and disorder, being associated with crime or disorder or being used to support crime;
2. Ensuring that gambling is conducted in a fair and open way, and
3. Protecting children and other vulnerable persons from being harmed or exploited by gambling

The Licensing Committee may:

1. Grant the application for the Premises Licence subject to the mandatory conditions and default conditions (pursuant to sections 167 and 168 of the Act) or
2. Grant the application for the Premises Licence subject to the mandatory conditions but excluding specific default conditions AND/OR attach additional conditions. An additional condition may apply to the premises generally or only in relation to a specified part of the premises
3. Reject the application

Section 153 (1) of the Act provides that licensing authorities should aim to permit the use of premises for gambling in so far as they think it:

1. in accordance with any relevant code of practice under section 24;
2. in accordance with any relevant guidance issued by the Gambling Commission under section 25;
3. reasonably consistent with the licensing objectives; and
4. in accordance with the authority's statement of licensing policy.

The guidance issued by the Commission states at Paragraph 1.19 that therefore "a licensing authority has no discretion in exercising its functions under Part 8 of the Act to grant a premises licence where that would mean taking a course which it did not think accorded with the Guidance, any relevant Commission Code of Practice or the Licensing Authority Statement of Policy or to be consistent with the licensing objectives".

Section 153 (2) of the Act goes on to state that in "determining whether to grant a premises licence a licensing authority may not have regard to the expected demand for the facilities which it is proposed to provide".

In respect of the imposition of Conditions by the Licensing Authority, Section 169 (4) states that a "licensing authority may not attach a condition to a premises licence which prevents compliance with a condition of the operating licence which authorises the holder to carry out the activity in respect of which the premises licence is granted".

GUIDANCE ISSUED BY THE GAMBLING COMMISSION UNDER SECTION 25 OF THE GAMBLING ACT 2005

- 5.10 “As applicants for premises licences (except occupiers of tracks who do not propose to offer gambling themselves) will have to hold an operating licence from the Commission before the premises licence can be issued, licensing authorities will not need to investigate the suitability of an applicant. If during the course of considering a premises licence application, or at any other time, the licensing authority receives information that causes it to question the suitability of the applicant to hold an operating licence, these concerns should be brought to the attention of the Commission without delay.”
- 5.11 “ Among other matters, licensing authorities may need to consider the location of premises in the context of this licensing objective. If an application for a licence or permit is received in relation to premises that are in an area noted for particular problems with organised crime, for example, licensing authorities should think about what (if any) controls might be appropriate to prevent those premises becoming a source of crime. These might include conditions being put on the licence, such as a requirement for door supervisors.”
- 5.16 “Local authorities should note that in the case of gambling premises licences, disorder is intended to mean activity that is more serious and disruptive than mere nuisance. Factors to consider in determining whether a disturbance was serious enough to constitute disorder would include whether police assistance was required and how threatening the behaviour was to those who could see or hear it. There is not a clear line between nuisance and disorder and the licensing authority should take the views of its lawyers before determining what action to take in circumstances in which disorder may be a factor.”

Paragraph 5.20 underlines that with “limited exceptions, the intention of the Gambling Act is that children and young persons should not be permitted to gamble and should be prevented from entering those gambling premises which are adult-only environments. The objective refers to protecting children from being ‘harmed or exploited by gambling’. That means preventing them from taking part in gambling and for there to be restrictions on advertising so that gambling products are not aimed at children or advertised in such a way that makes them particularly attractive to children, excepting Category D gaming machines.”

Paragraph 5.22 states that the Act “does not seek to prohibit particular groups of adults from gambling in the same way that it prohibits children. The Commission does not seek to define ‘vulnerable persons’, but it does for regulatory purposes assume that this group includes people who gamble more than they want to; people who gamble beyond their means; and people who may not be able to make informed or balanced decisions about gambling due to mental health needs, learning disability or substance misuse relating to alcohol or drugs.”

Paragraph 5.23 concludes that “Licensing authorities need to consider, in relation to particular premises, whether any special considerations apply in relation to the protection of vulnerable persons. Any such considerations need to be balanced against the authority’s objective to aim to permit the use of premises for gambling.”



Gaming and gambling outlets cause, facilitate, and attract criminal and Public disorder activities, because they are easily accessible to the vulnerable who are easily exploited, who are easily harmed, who are easily led to spend more of their disposable income and often have to resort to criminal activity as a way of getting money to carry on gambling and repay debt problems; (forgery, embezzlement, fraud, money laundering, passing counterfeit currency, theft, assault, prostitution, vandalism, loan sharking, victimization of family members related problem to gambling involvement and addiction, domestic violence, child neglect. Harmed by addiction to gambling, They can use loan sharks that generally exacerbate their addiction because debts

are magnified as is the stress about not being able to repay the loan. They experience the following sequence of events: asset losses; accumulating debts; exhausting legal means of obtaining funds; including borrowing from family and friends; drawing on savings and retirement funds; cash advances on credit cards; and loans from financial institutions or loan sharks) committing crime becomes their only option. Crime and public disorder related to gambling can occur in the vicinity of gaming and gambling outlets as well as on them. Verbal abuse; physical violence spilling out on to the streets; purse snatching; fights between patrons

and assaults on staff; bulding
society staff; post office staff;
and assaults of staff of gambling
and gaming outlets. (Ref: Poyner and Warner 1986;
Buckel 1988)

The proliferation of gambling and
gaming outlets in the London Borough
of Hillingdon, Seven already
within a quarter mile stretch of
Hayes Town decreases, and replaces

benefits of local quality small businesses, that limit commercial choice for local residents, deterring other potential commercial investment.

The William Hills chief executive has been cited as saying in the Haringey Independent local rag on the 15th October 2-10 "betting shops bring benefits"

Since the passing of the 2007 gambling and Lotteries Act, what benefits are betting shops bringing?? Instead the effects of the Act have raised concerns for local authorities and communities throughout

the UK, issues such as the increase of people being treated for gambling addiction and the inevitable cost to the N.H.S.,

as well as the proliferation and saturation of gambling and gaming outlets in areas of deprivation where crimes and anti social behaviour are a reality for local residents and commercial investment in the area, as well as the negative effects that problem gambling can have with its associated anti social behaviour in the wider community, like drink related violence generated by frustration over losing a large amount money on a bet. 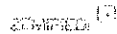
A DRUG dealer who used a bookmakers to sell cannabis to a 13-year old has been sent to prison.

Brighton benefits cheat stole from charity shop to feed gambling habit

A benefits cheat who is addicted to gambling stole from a charity shop he was ordered to work in to repay his debt to society.

Alexandro Masarella was caught pocketing cash from the till at the Mind shop in St James's Street, Brighton, to feed his betting habit.

Masarella, 41, was ordered to do 240 hours unpaid work after being convicted of stealing hundreds of pounds in benefits he was not entitled to.

He liked the work so much he asked if he could stay on as a volunteer after he had completed his punishment.

His boss noticed the till was £15 short when she cashed up on September 9, last year.

When she played footage from the shop's security cameras she saw Masarella pocketing money handed over by two customers.

Masarella, admitted two charges of theft and appeared at Brighton Magistrates' Court for sentence yesterday.

Brian Mackrell, defending, said: "He unfortunately has a problem with a gambling addiction.

"It was a totally impulsive act fuelled by his desire to gamble which he is taking steps to deal with.

"He was still gambling and was in debt when he committed these offences to enable him to gamble further.

"He is deeply ashamed of what he did as this was a job that he liked doing."

Masarella, of Bramble Way, Hollingbury, Brighton, was ordered to do another 240 hours unpaid community work within 12 months.

He must also pay £15 compensation to Mind and £15 towards prosecution costs.

170K fraud fed adviser's betting habit

Barclays adviser is jailed after stealing cash from account of a man who died over 20 years ago

A former West Midlands financial adviser has been jailed after admitting a 170,000 fraud.

Dean Abeal admitted conspiracy to defraud when he appeared before Birmingham Crown Court and was jailed for 21 months.

His co-defendant Geoffrey Williams admitted similar charges and was jailed for 16 months.

The court heard that Abeal had been working as a financial adviser for Barclays when he and Williams began planning to extract money from a dormant account belonging to a Spanish man who had died in 1984.

At first, the pair took small amounts totalling 5,000 over an 18-month period beginning in 2003. The fraud was uncovered when the pair began to take bigger amounts, culminating in one withdrawal of 80,000.

This withdrawal triggered an internal investigation and the fraud was revealed. The total amount siphoned off into an account set up by Abeal was 170,000.

In mitigation, the court was told that the men had acted in order to feed their gambling habits.

Williams, the court heard, was not a financial adviser but a former professional snooker player.

Following the case, Barclays regional liaison manager in the West Midlands Lisa Kennedy told Money Marketing: "I cannot comment on this case specifically but I can say that Barclays spends a great deal of time and money on protecting the interests of our customers and ourselves against the actions of would-be fraudsters.

"We employ 60,000 people in the UK and staff fraud is rare. However, it is something that can happen in any organisation, no matter how stringent the vetting procedures are.

"We are alive to the possibility and we take steps to minimise the risk and detect it quickly if it does happen."

Royal Mail cleaner stole money to feed gambling addiction

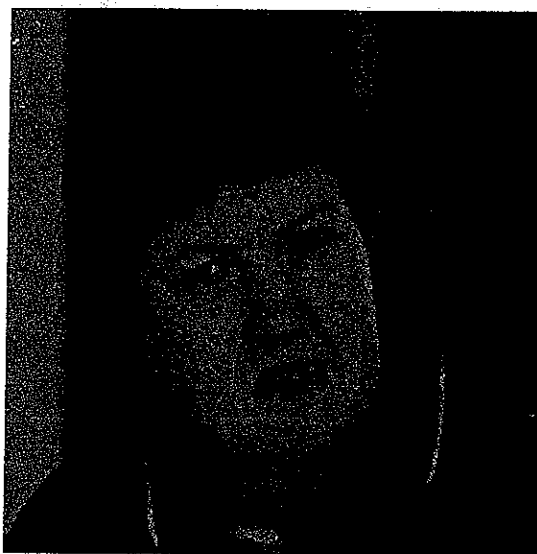

A CLEANER at the Royal Mail who stole money and gift vouchers from around 1,600 items of post to feed her gambling addiction left children waiting for birthday cards and presents that never came, Bournemouth Magistrates Court heard yesterday.

Former agency cleaner Claire Hayes, of Symes Road, Hamworthy, pleaded guilty to four counts of theft at Ferndown and Wimborne delivery offices, admitting that she would rip up around 20 greeting cards a day, pocketing the contents and stowing the envelopes in rubbish bags to be thrown away.

Royal Mail prosecutor Bob Booker said the theft of more than £600, from mail waiting to be delivered as well as post that hadn't been sorted yet, came to light last August after £40 went missing from an office cash tin.

Investigating officers, finding 39 opened cards in black sacks in the yard at Wimborne's East Street office, ordered the council to leave the rubbish at Ferndown's Queens Street office, where Hayes also worked, so it could be searched too.

Conditions attached to every Betting (other) premises licence

Mandatory – All premises

- 1) The summary of the premises licence shall be displayed in a prominent place within the premises.
- 2) The layout of the premises shall be maintained in accordance with the plan.
- 3) The premises shall not be used for –
 - a. The sale of tickets in a private lottery
 - b. The sale of tickets in any other lottery in respect of which the sale of tickets on the premises is otherwise prohibited.

Betting Premises - Mandatory

- 1) A notice stating that no person under the age of 18 years is permitted to enter the premises shall be displayed in a prominent place at every entrance to the premises.
- 2) No customer shall be able to enter the premises directly from any other premises used for the purposes of effecting with persons resorting to those other premises of transactions other than betting transactions.
- 3) Subject to anything permitted by virtue of the Act, or done in accordance with paragraphs 4, 5, 6 and 7 below, the premises shall not be used for any purpose other than for providing facilities for betting.
- 4) Any ATM made available for use on the premises shall be located in a place that requires any customer who wishes to use it to leave any gaming machine in order to do so.
- 5) No apparatus for making information or other material available in the form of sounds or visual images may be used on the premises, except for apparatus used for the following purposes—
 - (a) communicating information about, or coverage of, sporting events, including—
 - (i) information relating to betting on such an event; and
 - (ii) any other matter or information, including an advertisement, which is incidental to such an event.
 - (b) communicating information relating to betting on any event (including the result of the event) in connection with which betting transactions may be or have been effected on the premises.
- 6) No publications, other than racing periodicals or specialist betting publications, may be sold or offered for sale on the premises.
- 7) No music, dancing, or other entertainment shall be provided or permitted on the premises, save for entertainment provided in accordance with paragraph 5.
- 8)
 - (1) No alcohol shall be sold, or permitted to be consumed, at any time during which facilities for gambling are being provided on the premises.
 - (2) A notice stating the condition in sub-paragraph (1) above shall be displayed in a prominent place at or near every entrance to the premises.

- 9) (1) The terms on which customers are invited to bet on the premises shall be displayed in a prominent place within the premises to which customers wishing to place a bet have unrestricted access.
- (2) This condition may be satisfied by placing a clear and legible sign displaying the terms within the premises, or by making available to customers, leaflets or other written material containing the rules of the casino games available to be played in the premises.
- (3) The following information shall be included in any terms that are displayed under paragraph (1)—
- a. the amount of the various deductions that may be, or will be, made from winning bets;
 - b. any maximum limit on the amount of winnings; and
 - c. the procedure for the resolution of disputed bets.

Betting Premises - Default

- 1) No facilities for gambling shall be provided on the premises between the hours of 10pm on one day and 7am on the next day.
