The Mayor welcomed a group of journalism students from Brunel to the meeting.

The Civic Service held with the Training Corp who had provided the line up at the Church, the Mayor thanked those staff that had made the event such a success.

A tea party in honour of work undertaken by the women who contributed to the war effort during the Second World War held for members of the Women's Land Army and Women's Timber Corps (WLA and TC).

The Project to clear the Grand Union Canal Tow Path undertaken in Hayes with the rubbish collected taken away on barges.

The Mayor notified the meeting of the following forthcoming events:-

- 11 March between 11a.m. and 2p.m. Pield Heath School would be in the Chimes and this event would be well worth a visit.

4. STATEMENT BY COUNCILLOR DOUGLAS MILLS

REPORT OF THE HEAD OF DEMOCRATIC SERVICES

(i) MEMBERSHIP CHANGES AND APPOINTMENTS TO OUTSIDE BODIES

RECOMMENDATION: To make any appointments to Committees and Outside Bodies as notified by the Whips at the Council meeting (to follow).

(ii) PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION AND TIMETABLE OF MEETINGS

RECOMMENDATION: That the proposed amendments to the Constitution, as detailed below be approved with immediate effect and that, subject to that approval, the Council's timetable of meetings be amended so that formal meetings of the Executive Scrutiny Committee take place after Cabinet meetings.

INFORMATION

- The Constitution of the London Borough of Hillingdon sets out how the Council operates, how decisions are made and the procedures which are followed to ensure that these are efficient, transparent and accountable to local people. Many of these processes are required by law, while others are a matter for the Council to choose. The Constitution contains 16 Articles, which set out the basic rules governing the Council's business.
- 2. The Constitution is reviewed on a regular basis to keep it up to date with legislative changes, best practice and to continue to meet the needs of the political interface, which is integral to the effective running of the Council.
- 3. **The Executive Scrutiny Committee** at its meeting on 2 June 2009 gave consideration to proposals to improve the effectiveness of the Committee's performance and its work programme for 2009/10 and are making the following proposals:
 - For a formal Executive Scrutiny Committee meeting to take place at the rising of Cabinet meetings (currently this meeting is *informal*). At this meeting Members would review the decisions taken at the Cabinet meeting and give consideration to the potential for call-ins of items. On areas where further information or clarification was sought, officers would be asked to provide a response to the Committee queries by midday on the following Monday.
 - These responses would be sent to Members of this Committee by email, and based on this information, Members would be asked to email or telephone Democratic Services on whether they were content with the information supplied or whether they recommended the calling –in of the particular item. The majority of the Committee Members would have to agree to the call-in request for it to proceed.
 - If an item was called in, another formal meeting of the Committee would take place on the Tuesday (or the Thursday at the latest) of the following

week after Cabinet, where relevant officers and the relevant Cabinet Member, if appropriate, would be invited to discuss the called-in item.

- The suggested changes require a change to both the Council's timetable of meetings and the Constitution in respect of the rules of procedure relating to Call-ins.
- If the proposed changes are approved the first formal meeting of the Executive Scrutiny Committee would be on 16 July, at the rising of the Cabinet meeting.

HRA RENT INCREASES – 2009/2010

Summary

Members will recall the decision of Council on 26 February concerning this matter. Cabinet on 19 March 2009 agreed that until Council made a new determination, council tenants would be notified in writing with immediate effect that they would be liable to pay an interim 3.1%. average annual increase in rent - thereby suspending the 26 February 2009 Council decision of increasing average rents by 6.20 %. This was based on an expectation that following a ministerial announcement, a formal notification from the Government would be received that would amend the Council's HRA Subsidy to cover for the loss of income associated with reducing average rents to 3.1 %. Such formal notification has been received in the form of the Housing Revenue Account Subsidy Determination 2009-10 Amending Determination 2009 and Council is being recommended to rescind its previous decision to increase Council rents by an average of 6.2% for 2009/10 and instead confirm an annual average increase of 3.1% for 2009/10. Tenants will then be notified accordingly.

RECOMMENDATION: That Council:

- a) rescind its previous decision made on 26 February 2009 to set an annual average increase of 6.2% in rents payable by its tenants in respect of the 2009/10 financial year.
- b) Agree that there should be an annual average increase of 3.1% in rents payable by its tenants in respect of the 2009/10 financial year with effect from 6 April 2009.

Supporting Information

- As part of the normal budget setting process and in line with previous years, the HRA budget, including a rent increase of 6.2%, was determined by full Council on 26 February 2009 following the Cabinet meeting on 19 February 2009. Under the Constitution, any amendment to this figure will also have to be agreed by full Council.
- 2. Under this national framework, regulated by the DCLG, the level of charge was provided to the Council as part of the HRA subsidy determination in December 2008. In line with section 102 of the Housing Act 1985, immediately after the Council decision on rent levels for 2009/10, a notification was sent to tenants advising them of the Council's intention to raise the rent after 28 days. That letter was received by most tenants during the first week of March 2009.
- 3. On Friday 6 March 2009, the Housing Minister made an announcement that the Government was indeed changing the requirement under the

guideline rent charges for 2009/10 from the original 6.2% increase to 3.1%.

4. Following the Cabinet meeting of 19th March new letters were sent to tenants which informed them of an interim but immediate 3.1% increase pending a formal HRA Subsidy amendment. Once Council has rescinded the original valid average increase of 6.2 % and instead confirmed a revised increase of 3.1% for 2009/10, new letters will be sent out to tenants to formally confirm this decision.

Financial Implications

- 5. The Hillingdon dwelling rents average increase of 6.2%, approved by 19 February 2009 Cabinet, was based on property specific calculations using the rent restructuring formula provided by DCLG.
- 6. For 2009/10, the guideline rent increase comprised a general (inflation related) increase and an element due to convergence to formula rents modified by caps and limits. The caps and limits ensure that the formula does not result in very high increases for some tenants as a result of the convergence element of the formula. The 6.2% average increase agreed by Cabinet on 19 February 2009 included a rent increase of 7% for around 1,400 tenants.
- 7. The proposed changed guideline average annual rent increase for 2009-10 of 3.1% is similarly likely to result in variations for individual tenants and these will depend on the value of individual parameters set out by DCLG. The recommended interim rent increase is similarly being based on parameters set out in the Housing Revenue Account Subsidy Determination 2009-10 Amending Determination 2009, The use of these assumptions results in average increase of 3.1% as set out in table 1 below.

8. It should be noted that individual rents based on the average rents in the above table have already been applied as a result of the March 19th 2009 Cabinet decision to suspend the decision to increase rents by an average of 6.2% and instead apply an interim rent increase of 3.1% in anticipation of receiving formal documentation confirming the ministerial announcement of 6th March 2009.

CORPORATE IMPLICATIONS

Corporate Finance

9. The implications of rent levels for individual Council tenants are set out in the financial implications above. The key change between the situation described in the report to Cabinet on 19 March 2009 and the action now recommended to the Council has been the receipt of the Housing Revenue Account Subsidy Determination 2009-10 Amending Determination 2009 and its subsequent verification by officers. This now allows full Council to with confidence re-set rent levels for 2009/10 with the backing of the appropriate level of Government HRA rent subsidy in place.

Legal

10. In the event that Council agrees to set an annual average increase of 3.1% in rents payable by its tenants in respect of the 2009/10 financial year, Notices of Variation will have to be sent to all tenants in accordance with section 102 of the Housing Act 1985. Such Notices will replace those which were previously served by the Council on 27 February 2009.

"Could the Cabinet Member for the Environment tell me the cost of removing the unsightly fly posting placed by one of the political parties in the chamber in Yiewsley High Street during the recent elections?"

8.3 QUESTION FROM COUNCILLOR COX TO THE CABINET MEMBER FOR EDUCATION AND CHILDREN'S SERVICES – COUNCILLOR SIMMONDS

"In relation to the continuation of an excellent Pre School nursery at the Stables in the Manor Farm Complex for how long has it been the administration's policy to allow a good school facility to close in order to prioritise outside catering kitchen facilities."

8.4 QUESTION FROM COUNCILLOR HENSLEY TO THE LEADER OF THE COUNCIL – COUNCILLOR PUDDIFOOT

"The Mayor of London has established an Outer London Commission to report to him in July about the particular needs of Boroughs such as ours and to assist him in his policy to rewrite the London Plan. What involvement has Hillingdon had in this process?"

8.5 QUESTION FROM COUNCILLOR GARG TO THE TO THE LEADER OF THE COUNCIL – COUNCILLOR PUDDIFOOT

"While accepting that the planning application for the construction of up to 3750 homes on the former Southall Gas Works site will be decided through the normal planning process, can the Leader of the Council say whether he agrees that the impact of this development on Hayes Town could be so great that the Council should refuse to sell the land it owns, which is needed for access to the site from the Hayes By-Pass, until any detrimental impacts have been addressed and maximum benefits secured for the people of Hillingdon?"

8.6 QUESTION FROM COUNCILLOR KHURSHEED TO THE TO THE LEADER OF THE COUNCIL – COUNCILLOR PUDDIFOOT

"Can the Leader of the Council explain why the system set up by the Council and the Police, to monitor community tensions in the Borough, fails to include all Ward Councillors and Members of Parliament as both potential sources and recipients of information and will he give an undertaking that this will be remedied immediately?"

8.7 QUESTION FROM COUNCILLOR ALLEN TO THE CABINET MEMBER FOR CULTURE, SPORT AND LEISURE – COUNCILLOR HIGGINS

"Seeing that the Council has conspicuously failed to erect a signboard to tell the people of Hayes about the Botwell Green Sports and Leisure Centre, will the Cabinet Member for Culture, Sport and Leisure give a commitment that local residents will be given the opportunity to shape the programme of activities so that the Centre meets local needs and at prices they can afford to pay?"

8.8 QUESTION FROM COUNCILLOR HARMSWORTH TO THE CABINET MEMBER FOR CULTURE, SPORT AND LEISURE – COUNCILLOR HIGGINS

"Would the Cabinet Member confirm or otherwise, the information that I have received from a resident that a number of members of staff were instructed to use the ice rink in the early days of the Christmas period to make it look popular and that one member of staff suffered broken bones as a result?"

8.9 QUESTION FROM COUNCILLOR WAY TO THE CABINET MEMBER FOR SOCIAL SERVICES, HEALTH AND HOUSING – COUNCILLOR CORTHORNE

"Can the Cabinet Member for Social Services Health and Housing reassure Members and Hillingdon's Council Tenants by confirming that there are no plans to knock down our Council Housing Stock and move out people on low income to other parts of London, as appears to be the case in the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham?"

MOTIONS

9.1 MOTION FROM COUNCILLOR JANET GARDNER:

This Council deplores the fact that two British National Party candidates have been elected to represent the interests of the United Kingdom in the European Parliament and believes that their divisive and ill-informed views are a danger to the cohesion of the nation.

While welcoming the failure of the BNP to secure a seat in London, this Council is alarmed to see that it received 4689 votes from Hillingdon residents. It believes that this demonstrates that there can be no room for complacency as a result of the BNP's lack of electoral breakthrough in London and that all of us here must work together to prevent them advancing in the 2010 Borough Council elections.

The Council resolved to re-double its efforts to break down barriers between communities in the Borough and calls on the Cabinet to review the actions being taken by the Council and its strategic partners to achieve this objective.

9.2 MOTION FROM COUNCILLOR TONY EGINTON:

Enhancing the competitive position of businesses in the Borough and thereby improving the prospects for employment is one of the aims of the Council.

The introduction of higher parking charges for non-Hillingdon residents is likely to affect the number of shoppers and businesses in town centres in Hillingdon. If the number of shoppers and businesses fall in our town centres, it is probable that our town centres will suffer to the benefit of those in neighbouring authorities.

The Council calls on the Cabinet to immediately consult with retailers, businesses, town centre partnerships and residents' associations throughout the Borough so as to gauge the effect of the higher charges. As a result of the consultation, Council asks the Cabinet to review the level of charges within six months.
