

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

#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

1. A petition with 21 signatures has been submitted to the Council from residents of Kirby Close, Northwood signed under the following heading:

"Installation of yellow lines and parking bays in Kirby Close"

In an accompanying letter sent to officers the lead petitioner has helpfully provided the additional information;

"The residents of Kirby Close are most grateful for your understanding in the matter and seeking our views of where we would like the yellow lines and parking bays installed

The residents had a meeting and we agreed unanimously what we would like. It is a combination of extending double yellow lines further into the close and some Resident Parking Bays (for residents only at any time) I have completed this on the plan that you sent. Trust this is clear but please do feel free to ring me to obtain any clarification or indeed EM me.

My understanding from the Council website is that each resident would be able to have one free parking permit and 10 free visitor vouchers per year. I would be grateful of you could please confirm that my understanding is correct."

- 2. Kirby Close is a residential cul-de-sac comprising of nine detached homes all of which appear to have access to off-street parking. The road is accessed from Frithwood Avenue and is surrounded by an existing Parking Management Scheme (Zone N) which operates Monday to Friday 1-2pm. Kirby Close is within easy walking distance of Northwood Town Centre, the Metropolitan Line station, local schools and other amenities which could make it an attractive place for non-residents to park. A plan of the area is attached as Appendix A.
- 3. Within the petition residents have suggested a Parking Management Scheme which operates "at all times" which is far greater than the nearby scheme which was developed to address residents' concerns of commuter parking which they associated with the station. In the main the one hour a day restriction has been well received by the wider community as it prevents all day parking but at the same time allows guests, family, and service providers to park outside of the hour without the need for visitor vouchers.
- 4. Usually it would be recommended that unrestricted roads adjacent to an existing scheme be have the same operating days and times as the rest of the area but there may be reasons that residents of Kirby Close believe that a parking scheme "for residents only at any time" is more appropriate for their circumstances. It is therefore recommended that the Cabinet Member discusses with petitioners their concerns and if appropriate asks officers to add the request to the future extensive parking scheme programme for further investigation and informal consultation with residents.

#### **Financial Implications**

There are no direct financial implications associated with recommendations to this report. However, if the Council was to consider the introduction of managed parking in Kirby Close, funding would need to be identified from a suitable source.



#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

The Council has received a petition submitted by residents signed under the following heading:

"To part repave the pedestrian pathways to The Uplands, Ruislip, HA4 with mostly paving slabs (blocks)/part tarmac in a similar/same style as that installed in neighbouring streets, for example The Ridgeway, Ruislip, HA4".

The petition requests that the existing tarmac pavement be replaced with paving slabs and tarmac, like that found on The Ridgeway in Ruislip. The Ridgeway resurfacing was undertaken on a like-for-like basis, which meant that the existing paving and bitumen verge were resurfaced.

The Uplands, on the other hand, has a bitumen surfaced footpath. The current proposal is to reconstruct for this road is a bitumen footway on a "like-for-like basis" in accordance with the Council's policy.

An "intelligent intervention" was used to deal with this petition, and a letter outlining the proposal was sent to the lead petitioner. The lead petitioner is unsatisfied with the proposed tarmac resurfacing. The request for a change of surface material to replace the existing footway with paving slabs and bitumen verge will incur an additional cost of 60%, more than a like-for-like replacement, since full depth reconstruction of the footway is required.

The approved budget for these works is £86,579. Furthermore, a detailed assessment of the existing utility ducts is required to determine the viability of a new construction method. The Uplands becomes Myrtle Avenue and changing the material type will have a negative impact on the street scene.

#### **Financial Implications**

The 2021/22 Highways Structural Programme has had capital release to carry out footway works to The Uplands, Ruislip Manor for £87k. If the Cabinet Member agrees to uphold the petition, this will require a change in the material which will increase the cost of the footway works by 60% (£52k) to £139k.

The 2021/22 Highways Structural Programme budget of £10,471k has been fully released. The additional costs of £52k will have to funded from the approved 2022/23 budget of £6,000k and the works will have to be deferred.

#### **Infrastructure / Asset Management**

The footway improvement programme contains schemes to limit the deterioration of the fabric of the Borough's highway asset that can result in serious failure of footways, verges and improve the serviceability of the highway network for the benefit of residents and other road users.

The roads are selected from structural condition surveys undertaken by independent consultants to undertake condition surveys of the entire highway network in the borough. The surveys inform future maintenance decisions and consideration of footways for inclusion in preparing Highways planned works programmes.
