HEADLINE INFORMATION

Purpose of report To advise the Cabinet Member that a petition has been received from residents objecting to proposed developments at Ruislip Lido.

Contribution to our plans and strategies

The proposed improvements to Ruislip Lido are an integral aspect of the Council's HIP Programme and specifically addresses improving the quality of life for all Hillingdon residents.

There are no direct costs at this stage associated with improvements to Ruislip Lido as potential improvements are just at a draft stage.

INFORMATION

Reasons for recommendation

The proposed improvements are part of the Council's programme of improving parks and open spaces and will increase opportunities for Hillingdon residents to enjoy the leisure and amenity provision at Ruislip Lido.

Supporting Information

- 1. The proposed enhancement of Ruislip Lido is part of the Hillingdon Improvement Programme (HIP) and will be administered as a HIP Project via the HIP Steering Group.
- 2. As part of the pre-consultation work on this project a meeting was held with the Ruislip Lido Management Advisory Group on the 19th January 2010 (at which members of the public attended and questions from the floor were addressed) and a fuller meeting with the MAG Executive on the 30th March 2010. (Attendees shown at Appendix 1). A further meeting with the MAG Executive will be held in June 2010.
- 3. A petition with 513 signatures has been received from residents and non-residents (at least 20 of which were residents).
- 4. The first page of the petition states that 'Hillingdon Council is planning a major development of Ruislip Lido. We, the undersigned, believe that these plans will be detrimental to the Lido, adversely affect wildlife and cause further problems for the local residents and regular visitors. We also believe that there has been insufficient public consultation and that no further actions should be made on the part of Hillingdon Council until a thorough survey of public opinion has taken place'.

The petition goes on to state that 'Petitioners strongly oppose the proposed programme due to the adverse effect on existing and future wildlife which will be caused as a result of:

- The provision of a boating area for adults and children over 12
- The introduction of a paddle boating area for children
- The construction of a hard-surfaced area to accommodate an additional 200 cars'
- 5. An initial petition with 879 signatures (at least 20 of which were residents) was received by the Council in March 2010 and has been the subject of a Petition Hearing with the Cabinet Member for Environment on 14th April 2010. As the petition had not indicated what the petitioners were objecting to or supporting, a letter, listing the proposed developments (Appendix 2), was sent to every 10th signatory prior to the meeting asking for an indication of whether they were either in favour of, or objecting to the proposals. The feedback from these forms were collated and brought to the Petition Hearing for information.
- 6. As part of the pre-consultation work, consultant Engineers have been engaged to carry out a scoping report around Flood Risk in accordance with Environment Agency criteria.
- 7. As part of the pre-consultation work, consultant Engineers have been engaged to carry out a screening report around Environmental Impact in accordance with required criteria.
- 8. The proposed improvements have been identified in 'Hillingdon People' which has encouraged communication from residents

Financial Implications

As the improvements are only at an early stage the majority of the potential improvements have not yet been fully worked up and costed. Once agreed the proposals will be funded from the Councils capital programme where provision has been made for environmental improvements.

EFFECT ON RESIDENTS, SERVICE USERS & COMMUNITIES

What will be the effect of the recommendation?

To confirm the Council's intention to improve the Lido site, outline proposals and consultation process.

Consultation Carried Out or Required

- A Ruislip Lido Management Advisory Group meeting was held on the 19th January 2010, members of the public attended and questions from the floor were addressed.
- A meeting with the Ruislip Lido Management Advisory Group (MAG) Executive was held on the 30th March 2010 with the Leader of the Council. (Attendees shown at Appendix 1).
- A further meeting with the Ruislip Lido Management Advisory Group (MAG) Executive will be held in June 2010.
- A letter, listing the proposed developments (Appendix 2), was sent to every 10th signatory on on an initial petition received in March 2010 (87 in total) which asked for indication of whether they were either in favour of, or objecting to the proposals.
- As part of the pre-consultation work, consultant Engineers have been engaged to carry out a scoping report around Flood Risk in accordance with Environment Agency criteria
- As part of the pre-consultation work, consultant Engineers have been engaged to carry out a screening report around Environmental Impact in accordance with required criteria.
- The proposed improvements have been identified in 'Hillingdon People' which has encouraged communication from residents.

Once proposals have been firmed up and costed, Hillingdon residents will be contacted in a variety of ways via Residents Associations, personal contact and through Hillingdon People.

CORPORATE IMPLICATIONS

Corporate Finance

Corporate Finance has reviewed the report and recommendations and are satisfied that there are no direct financial implications arising from this report.

Legal

The Council in its capacity as landowner has begun a non-statutory period of consultation. No statutory processes have been initiated, so at this time the Council is not under a statutory obligation to consult. If more detailed proposals are brought forward and these require planning permission, then upon an application for planning permission being made the Council will be

required to adhere to the statutory publicity requirements then in force, which will affore interested persons a full opportunity to make representations.


