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REASON FOR ITEM

The Committee is required by its terms of reference to consider the Forward Plan and comment as appropriate to the decision maker on key decisions that relate to services within its remit (before they are taken by Cabinet or Cabinet Member).

At the meeting of 25 September 2013 the Committee requested clarification on the standard item, "Sale, and Conversion, of loft space to leaseholders and also extension of Leasehold Interests of flats under the 1993 Act".

Occasionally, Cabinet Members are asked by officers to approve the grant of an extension to the leasehold interests of flats, where the Council is freeholder. Formal applications are made by the leaseholders under the Leasehold Reform, Housing and Urban Development Act 1993 and the Council has to respond by means of a Counter Notice and then to agree a premium for the extended term in each case.

Similarly, Cabinet Members may also be asked to approve the extensions of leasehold interests on loft-spaces. Additionally, a small number of residents also put in occasional requests to purchase the loft space from the Council above their flat to increase the size of their home.

Updates on other areas of the Forward Plan requested at this meeting will be provided to the Committee in due course.
