Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions**Mandatory Conditions - Alcohol**

1. No sale/supply of alcohol shall be made when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the premises licence
2. No sale/supply of alcohol shall be made when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or when his/her Personal Licence is suspended.
3. Every sale/supply of alcohol under the premises licence shall be made, or authorised, by a person who holds a Personal Licence
4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold

or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”

Mandatory Condition - Permitted Price

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Annex 2– Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule**General**

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that the following licence conditions are fully complied with.

The council's rules of management for public house annexed hereto shall be fully complied with.

The sale of alcohol shall be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.

The premises must be structurally adapted and bona-fide intended to be used for the purpose of providing for persons resorting to the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment to which the sale of alcohol is ancillary.

Public safety

The gate located across the external means of escape route from the patio/garden area shall be kept in the unlocked position whenever the public are upon the premises.

The room divider/folding partition shall be locked back in the open position whenever the premises are in use under this licence.

Prevention of public nuisance

The approved sound limitation equipment installed within the premises shall be checked and tested at regular intervals to ensure that it is in effective working order and will operate at the sound level specified by the Council's Environmental Protection Unit.

Prevention of crime and disorder

On each of the days Monday to Thursday the external patio area shall not be used for drinking after 23.00 hours

On each of the days Friday and Saturday the external patio area shall not be used for drinking after 00.00 hours

On Sundays the external patio area shall not be used for drinking after 22.30 hours

On Fridays and Saturdays, there shall be a minimum of two Door Supervisors employed at the premises. The Door Supervisors shall be on duty from 21.00 hours until 01.30 hours the following day.

On Fridays and Saturdays, the local 'staff alert' alarms located on both the alternative means of escape exit doors shall be in operation from 21.00 hours until 01.30 hours so that, if the doors are opened the alarms will sound. The alarms shall both be checked and tested at regular intervals to ensure that they are in effective working order.

Whenever the premises is used for the purpose of the licence, the CCTV system installed at the premises which shall be capable of recording the facial images of persons entering the public house via the main entrance/exit doors, shall be switched on and shall not be switched off until at least 30 minutes after the premises has closed.

The recorded CCTV images shall be stored in a secure location for a period of at least 28 days and shall be available for inspection on request by authorised officers of the Council and the Metropolitan Police Service.

Protection of children from harm

No children under the age of 18 shall be allowed on the premises after 21.00 hours

A proof of age scheme shall be in operation.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits on the premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premise, including the car park, and the area quietly.

The two pairs of main entrance/exit doors to the main entrance/exit lobby shall be fitted with self-closing devices which shall cause the doors to become effectively self-closing within their frames. The installation and maintenance of the devices shall be to the satisfaction of the Council's Licensing Service.
