I am a nurse and have lived here for 10 years now so This is will be an issue for me. I work all days of the week with 12 hour shifts. How can this restaurant /bar/club reassure this will not affect me.

My son is a carpenter/builder. He too has to be up very early and travel all over London.

They have not consulted myself or neighbours in any discussion, they went ahead and placed the ventilation systems above his shop, I do not understand how he was able to just do this without any thought or consideration of others.

From my experience they are unlikely to keep their back doors closed from 7.30 in the evenings, the kitchen noise will be disruptive especially the late hours, LaHore evidence this every time. They don't consider the flats are immediately above, and not built for the purpose of clubs/restaurants scenes.

Further to consultation between myself and the applicant following concerns raised by residents the applicant has decide to amend the application as follows that may allay your concerns:

Withdraw the part of the application for recorded music and reduce the terminal hour for late night refreshment, sale of alcohol and opening hours to midnight Sunday to Thursday and 1.00am on Friday and Saturday.

Re - word existing conditions:

Prevention of crime and disorder

The installed CCTV system shall be maintained in effective working order at all times. The CCTV system shall retain all recordings for a minimum of 31 days and shall contain the correct date and time of the image capture. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon request to the Police and/or authorised officers of the London Borough of Hillingdon.

Protection of children from harm

A Challenge 25 scheme shall be operated at the premises. Only photographic ID shall be acceptable as proof of age (passport, photo driving licence, or PASS card).

Add following conditions:

The prevention of public nuisance

No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises that gives rise to a nuisance.

The external back door shall be kept closed between 19.00 hours and [closing] hours, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.

Notices shall be prominently displayed near the entrance and exit doors requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.

Staff shall monitor customers smoking outside the premises on a regular basis to ensure patrons do not cause a public nuisance.

Protection of children from harm

Staff shall be trained in responsible alcohol retailing. Staff training records shall be made available for inspection upon request by officers of a Responsible Authority
