It is obvious that they have no intention to comply with their licence agreement so I would support that the shop front licence should not be granted.

Heathrow Villages Ward : Renewal of Shop Front- Sarin Express 212 High Street Harlington UB3 5DS

Sarin Express is situated in a set of shops in the middle of the mainly residential Harlington Conservation area. It is the most recent addition to a number of mini supermarkets in the High Street. The owners display goods and an encroaching amount of consumables outside the front of the shop on the pavement, which may set a precedent for the other shops in the vicinity. The overall appearance is untidy and unkempt, detrimental to the street scene, a potential health hazard to the public and attracts anti social behaviour which is now a reality on Harlington High Street. I consider that for these reasons the renewal of the shop front licence should be declined.
